

Alumni Feedback Report (Academic Year 2022-2023)

The feedback committee through its members invites alumni feedback annually, by direct approaching to the members of association and other alumni. The questionnaire which is used to collect information is student centric. The questionnaire encompasses different areas like - University curriculum, need of special training programme, college atmosphere and culture growth opportunity, campus facilities, safety support services, extracurricular activities, responsiveness and helpfulness of administration. Responses from 26 alumni were obtained for the feedback.

The following analysis was made on the basis of the information collected through the feedback from employees of the designation / occupation of the respondents (34.6 % State Government employees, 11.5 % entrepreneurs and 42.3 % private employees) with 69.2 % respondents were male and 30.8% were female. These respondents were the students of the college between the years 1993 to 2022, 42.3 % of the alumni belonged to commerce, 19.2 % arts and 23.1 % were from science. 57.7 % are under-graduate level, 11.5 % post-graduate level and 30.8 % belonged to both levels.

The 73.1 % respondent alumni think that they are familiar with the curriculum prescribed by the University while 19.2 % gave negative responses. 76.9 % alumni are satisfied with the curriculum prescribe by the affiliating University but up to 11.5 % responses were partially satisfied with the curriculum. 19.2 % felt that the curriculum was job oriented whereas 61.5 % felt that it was not and 19.2 % felt that it was partially job oriented. Respondent 76.9 % alumni thought that need of curriculum redesigning to meet global requirements and jobs competencies while 11.5 % were not sure about curriculum redesigning. About 73.1 % think that there is need of special training programme to stand in global market with affirmative opinion and 15.4 % felt that it was partially needed.

Most of the respondents appreciated college's atmosphere and culture, 50 % Alumni thoughts that the college provides ample opportunities for personal and academic growth. 92.3 % said that they were satisfied with the resources and support made available to them by the college while 3 % of them were not satisfied, 4.7 % had mixed opinion. 88.5 % agreed that the college helped them in shaping their future career, 3.8 % had adverse opinion and 7.7 % had mixed opinion. 88.5 % response is satisfied with the overall atmosphere of the college and the remaining 11.5 % had mixed opinion. About the campus facilities and their standards the

responses of 88.5 % were positive, 7.7 % had negative answers, and the remaining 3.8 % had mixed opinion.

The 92.2 % alumni respondents are confident about the safety and comfortable on campus while rests of the respondents were in dilemma about what response to be given. 84.6 % of the respondents affirmed that there was a sense of community and inclusivity among the student body and their classmates whereas 15.4 % were unsure about it.

The extracurricular activities available in the college credits 80.8 % by the alumni as enough, 11.5 % replied that they were not enough whereas 7.7 % were unsure about them. 92.3 % of the respondents confirmed that the college administration was responsive and helpful to their needs and concern, 3% said it was not and the remaining 4.7 % were unsure about it.


Very Good/ Good Responses: The alumni respondent gives the very good/ good responses for the following points:-

1. Satisfied with the curriculum prescribe by the affiliating University
2. The college provides ample opportunities for personal and academic growth.
3. Satisfied with the resources and support made available to them by the college.
4. The college helped them in shaping their future career.
5. Satisfied with the overall atmosphere of the college.
6. The safety and comfortable on campus.
7. A sense of community and inclusivity among the student body and their classmates
8. The extracurricular activities available in the college
9. The college administration was responsive and helpful to their needs and concern

The feedback report was put before CDC for valuable suggestions as follows:

1. 76.9 % alumni thought that need of curriculum redesigning to meet global requirements and jobs competencies.
2. About 73.1 % think that there is need of special training programmes to stand in global market with affirmative opinion
3. 11.5 % the extracurricular activities available in the college is not sufficient.


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
