### 2.7.1- StudentSatisfactionSurvev(SSS)onoverallinstitutionalperformance -

Online survey was conducted through Google forms. Link of Google form was kept open for all and ispresent in feedback section (session 2022-23) of college website and Social Media Platform such as what's App and other like email address of the students as well.. Nearly $\mathbf{1 3 5}$ student's responses have been taken for making the report.

## 1. Howmuchofthesyllabuswascoveredin class?

Out of total students participated in survey about $40 \%$ answered $85-100 \%$ of syllabus iscovered in class, while about $17 . \%$ of students answered syllabus is covered up to $70-$ $84 \%$ and $30-54 \%$,respectively. $5 \%$ studentsrated syllabus completion less than30\%.

## 2. Howwelldid teacherspreparefortheclasses?

Around $55 \%$ of student responded, teachers prepare thoroughly and satisfactorily. $25 \%$ of studentsthink teachers prepare poorly or indifferently. Only $2 \%$ students reported that teachers don't teachat all.

## 3. Howwellwereteachersabletocommunicate?

Always effective ratings were given by $40 \%$ of students, while $30 \%$ of students think teacherseffectively and satisfactorily communicate. Only $02 \%$ student rated for very poor communicationofteachers.

## 4. Theteacher'sapproachtoteachingcanbest bedescribedas.

Teacher's approach to teaching was described as excellent and very good by $35 \%$ of students,whereas $35 \%$ students described teacher's approach as very good and fair. No student describedteacher'sapproachaspoor.

## 5. Fairnessforinternalevaluationprocessbytheteachers.

About $45 \%$ students find the internal evaluation process by the teachers as always fair and 6 \% found it usually fair. Only $1 \%$ students find the internal evaluation process by theteacherssometimes as unfairand usuallyunfair. $2 \%$ students rated rarely

## 6. Wasperformancein assignmentsdiscussedwithyou?

About $55 \%$ students approved that their performance in assignments is discussed usually everytime. About $8 \%$ of students reported their performance is discussed occasionally and rarely andnostudent voted fornever discussed.

About $67 \%$ students think that the teaching and mentoring process in the institution facilitatesthem in cognitive, social and emotional growth significantly and very well and $14 \%$ think that itismoderately and marginally. Only $2 \%$ student opted fornot atall.

About
\%studentsagreeandstronglyagreethattheinstitutionprovidesmultipleopportunities to learn and grow. About $20 \%$ students have a neutral opinion, whereas only $4 \%$ and $5 \%$ students disagreeand strongly disagree, respectively.

## 10. Teachersinformyouaboutyourexpectedcompetencies,courseoutcomes, andprogra mmeoutcomes.

About $77 \%$ students agree that teacher informs them about their expected competencies,
courseoutcome, and program outcome every time and usually. About $9 \%$ students think that teacherinformsthem occasionally, and only $11 \%$ students opted forrarelyand never.

## 11. Yourmentordoesanecessaryfollowup withanassigned taskwithyou.

About 56 \% studentsfeel that their mentor does a necessary follow up with an assignedtaskwiththem every timeand usually. Occasionalfollow up wasobservedby20 \% students.Only10 \%students opted forrarely and never.

## About78

\%studentsrepliedthattheteacherillustratesconceptsthroughexamplesandapplicationseveryt ime,and $22 \%$ studentsthinkthatteacherillustratesconceptsthroughexamplesand applications occasionallyandusually. No students opted for none.

## 13. Theteachersidentifyyourstrengthandencourageyouwithprovidingrightlevelofch allenges.

About $65 \%$ students fully and reasonably agree that the teacher identifies their strength andencourages them with providing right level of challenges, and $11.5 \%$ students partially and agreeslightly.Only1.4\%studentsthinkthattheteacherisunabletoidentifytheirstrengthandenc ouragethem with providing right level of challenges.

About $70 \%$ students feel that teachers are able to identify their weaknesses and help them toovercome them every time and usually. About $10 \%$ students think that teachers are occasionally andrarelyable to identifytheir weaknessesandhelp them toovercome them.Only3\% students optedfor

About 70 \% students agree and strongly agree that the institution makes effort to engage students ina monitoring review and continuous quality improvement of the teachinglearning process. About $21 \%$ students opted forneutral and $9 \%$ opted fordisagreeand strongly disagree.

About 70 \% students think that institution and teachers use student-centric methods to a greatmoderate extend. About $20 \%$ students opted for somewhat and very little. Only 8 $\%$ students believethatinstitution and teachers do not at all use student-centricmethods.

About 70 \% students agree and strongly agree that they received encouragement from teachers toparticipate in extra-curricular activities. About $22 \%$ students have opted for neutral. $8 \%$ students disagreeandstrongly disagree.

 loyabilityskills to makeyou ready forthe worldof work.About $65 \%$ students agree that to a great and moderate extent effort are made by the institution orteachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills to make them ready for the world ofwork.About 16 \%students optedfor somewhat and very little.None student has opted fornotat all.

Around $67 \%$ of students rated for range of $70-90 \%$, whereas $25 \%$ of students rated for $30-69 \%$ and $8 \%$ of students ratedfor less than $29 \%$.

About $65 \%$ students strongly agree and agree that the overall quality of teachinglearning processin the institute is very good. About $12 \%$ students were neutral. Only $3 \%$ student opted for disagree andstronglydisagree.
