Institutional Preparedness For NEP-2020

The National Education Policy 2020 is a comprehensive document. Our college has started preparing for the implementation of NEP-2020 in step-wise manner as under:

1. Multidisciplinary/Interdisciplinary:

- a) For holistic development of students, college focuses on their overall personality development. Accordingly, many programmes are organized.
- b) To integrate humanities and science with STEM, college will organize presentations and lectures of well-known resource persons.
- c) P.G. courses offered by the institute in Arts, Commerce faculties are CBCS and at UG level, it is yet to be implemented by the University. The college runs projects in the areas of community engagements and service, environmental education and value based education.
- d) The institute offers a liberal education unlocking all human capacities, and academic flexibilities to choose the elective courses offered by other departments and MOOCs through SWAYAM.
- e) In view of NEP-2020, college organizes Yoga day celebration, Road Safety Day, Blood Donation camp, etc.

2. Academic Bank of Credits (ABC):

The institute constituted a technical support team for registration of Academic Bank of Credits (ABC). Maximum students have been registered.

3. Skill Development :

The college has established Skill development and Entrepreneurship cell for strengthening technical, vocational and soft skill. The cell organizes training programs in Cyber Security. Workshop on skill development was organized. College Career Guidance and Placement Cell also organizes training-cum-guidance programs.

The institution plans to introduce some certificate courses in vermin-compost, plant identification, mushroom cultivation, hydroponics cultivation, Income Tax return filing, Banking and Financial Services, etc.

4. Appropriate integration of Indian knowledge System (teaching in Indian language, culture, and using online courses):

The courses offered by the college are multilingual e.g. English, Hindi and Marathi. The institute also offers degree in Music.

The institute has taken efforts to provide platform in the form of college magazine, where students express their views in the form of article, poems, experiences, etc. in their mother tongue. The college also provides hands-on training during practical hours in Indian arts and craft. Frequent field visits to local heritage sites are organized. Efforts are also being made to start the online courses on Indian traditional knowledge in future.


5. Focus on Outcome based Education :

The syllabi offered by the college are designed by the affiliating university. It is expected from affiliating university to start outcome based education from the next academic session. However, college has developed its own programme and course outcome based on the syllabi and made available on the college website.

6. Distance Education / online Education:

During Covid-19 pandemic situation, the college was well prepared for online education and extended online teaching-learning. Blended teaching-learning processes are used. Study material or contents are shared through different online modes. Some faculty members are well trained in using MOOCs and other online platforms. During Covid-19 pandemic online platforms were used.

The college is planning to offer MOOCs course in near future as per the New National Educational Policy- 2020.
